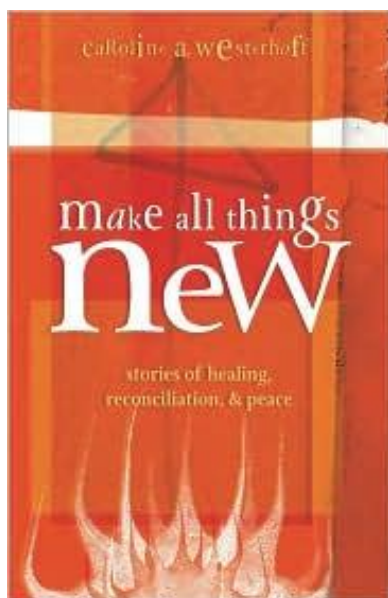

She was formerly a senior consultant with the Alban Institute, a visiting lecturer in religious education at the School of Theology at Sewanee, the University of the South, and a faculty member with the College of Preachers at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. She is a licensed preacher in the Episcopal Church.

Canon Westerhoff is the author of *Transforming the Ordinary*; *Make All Things New: Stories of Healing, Reconciliation, and Peace*; *Good Fences*; and *Calling: A Song for the Baptized*

and other books and resources. She and her husband, theologian John Westerhoff, live in Atlanta.
